What is a Vanpool?

5 or more commuters:

Consistent group of commuters who share a similar origin, destination and work schedule - could be neighbors, co-workers or friends.

Roles:

Members apply as a driver (at least 2) and a bookkeeper – an online orientation.

Group Operations:

Members decide on route, schedule and other logistics.

Everything is included:

Van, gas, tolls, insurance, maintenance, roadside assistance and emergency ride home program.





Metro Vanpool Details

WSDOT Toll Free:

Vanpools travel for free on all the WSDOT toll facilities – SR-99, SR-520, I-405 Express Tolls and Tacoma Narrows Bridge.

Vanpool cost:

Based on commute distance, vehicle size, work schedule and number of commuters. The average monthly fare is similar to a monthly transit pass - \$150/month.

Vanpool payment:

ORCA Business Passport, online with a credit card or by check.



Vanshare Program - First/Last Mile Connection

Vanshare:

Similar to vanpool with 5+people, key roles, and everything is included – gas, insurance, maintenance, etc.


Mileage:

Maximum 20-mile roundtrip commute.

Multiple vans at worksite: More options and flexibility for commuters.

Cost:

Vanshare cost is \$200/month split amongst the group or could also be covered by employer.




Connection: Commuters connect to another form of public transportation (train, bus or ferry).

<u>For example</u>: Vanshare vehicles parked at the **2 Line** station for the short commute to their worksite destination OR for the vanshare group to connect their home trip to the **2 Line** station.







Commuter features - dashboard showing commute savings, newsfeed, and current incentives.





Recent King County Metro Service Changes

Service Changes

The September Service change was focused on changes to Lynnwood Light Rail opening.

- Metro has added more east-west routes, and increased frequency on many to help people get to more places and to light rail.
- Community Transit has ended most Seattle routes and increased service in Snohomish County.
- · There were no changes to Eastside service.
- We will have significant changes to Eastside service next year when the Redmond Light Rail extension opens (Spring 2025), and when the 2 line is completed (Winter 2025)







 - Light rail across I-90 floating bridge
 - Mercer Island Station & Judkins Park Station
 - Connection to 1 Line at ID/Chinatown Station






Phase One



- Open!
- 6.5 miles
- 8 stations
 - Redmond Technology
 - Overlake Village
 - BelRed
 - Spring District
 - Wilburton
 - Bellevue Downtown
 - East Main
 - South Bellevue
- ~6,000 riders daily



Phase Two



- Spring 2025
- 3.4 miles of new track
- 2 new stations
 - Marymoor Village
 - Downtown Redmond
- 1,400 stall parking garage at Marymoor Village Station (ground level transit center)
- Downtown Redmond Station to Bellevue Downtown Station: 17 minutes





Phase Three



- Late 2025
- 34 total miles of track
- 26 total stations, including:
 - Mercer Island
 - Judkins Park (Seattle)
- Downtown Redmond to Downtown Bellevue: 42 minutes
- Transfer to 1 Line at Int'l District/Chinatown Station





Riding the 2 Line

Fares

• 1 Line and 2 Line: \$3

• TLine: \$2

• ST Express: \$3.25*

• Sounder: \$3.25 to \$5.75





Tap on. Tap off.

ORCA card readers are located at:

- Link station entrances
- Sounder train platforms
- ST Express buses, next to the driver
- 1 & 2 Lines, T Line, and ST Express
 - Tap <u>before</u> boarding

Sounder

• Tap your ORCA card <u>before and after</u> boarding the train (distance-based fare)





Multiple Ways to Pay

- Ticket machines
- Adult ORCA cards
- One way, return, or all-day rail tickets
- Pay with cash and credit/debit cards
- On your phone
- Transit GO ticket app
- Google Pay app
- Cash
- ST Express buses accept exact cash fares
- ST Fare Ambassadors check for proof of payment






Add between \$5 and \$300 on your ORCA e-purse or monthly pass





Transferring to/from Link Light Rail with ORCA

- If you transfer within 2 hours, your original fare is credited toward the next leg of your journey
- Only pay the difference if the second leg of your trip costs more than the first
- Most passengers enjoy completely free transfers with their ORCA card!

ETC STAR is a new program where the City of Bellevue rewards our ETCs that go above and beyond the call of duty!





ETC STAR AWARD CRITERIA Program Starts January 1, 2025!

AWARD CRITERIA:

- •*Attend all ETC Networking Meetings within the 2025 phase timeline
- •*Attend classes offered by City of Bellevue Transportation or Choose Your Way Bellevue within the 2025 phase timeline
- Participate in promotional activities offered by COB or CYWB
- Complete biannual CTR Survey within the deadline specified timeline designated by the city with an at least 50% employee response rate (even years)
- •Complete biannual CTR Program Report within the deadline specified by the city (odd years)
- •Bonus points: Attend and/or participate in external CTR and/or Transportation Demand Management (TDM)-related forums and meetings (ie: WSDOT TDM Technical Committee and Board of Directors meetings, Puget Sound Regional Council TDM stakeholder meetings, Washington State Rideshare Organization annual meeting, etc.
- *if primary company ETC cannot participate, a viable proxy will suffice


